Collection Organization

During the last months of 2022 Richard Wilkens began working on the organization of our collection. Starting with a wall to wall inventory we are working on consolidating shelves to make better use of the space available. This is helping to provide contiguous space for receiving larger donations. Also work is being done on creating more finding aids to better detail items in our collection.

Community Relations

Our annual open house after Thanksgiving was a large success. We advertised in several local blogs and had over 350 people attend the two day event. A highlight of the event was the Boeing Model Railroad Club layout.

We have been sharing surplus materials with our local heritage partners, at year end we moved two large flat files to the Highline Heritage Museum and loaned the Northwest Railway Museum two large air moving fans to assist in recovery from a flood under the depot.

For the first time on January 4th 2023 our bi-weekly Volunteer Zoom meeting had representation from all 6 US time zones (Eastern, Central, Mountain, Pacific, Alaska and Hawaii)

This past quarter we have sponsored public events live or via Zoom on the following topics: Railroad Art, Digital Archive Techniques, and Railroad History as well as special tours for conventions held in the area.

In 2022 PNRA received 90 new collections and as we all learn how to live with Covid our volunteer hours have gone up 70 percent from 2021 to 14,699 total in 2022. Thanks to all our volunteers helping to make PNRA successful.

Cherisse Gordon Joins PNRA Board

Cherisse Gordon has joined the PNRA board. She brings over 20 years of experience in public education and administration and is currently working for the Oregon Department of Education. She also brings a variety of railroad experience as a volunteer, along with her husband

and son, at Oregon Coast Scenic Railroad, Oregon Rail Heritage Center, Oregon Pacific Railroad and Mt. Rainier Scenic Railroad. As a member of the Oregon Air National Guard, Cherisse is nearing her 20th year of service.

AtoM Railroad Catalog Update

The first meeting of the AtoM coordinating committee appointed by our member society presidents was held in December. Going forward, quarterly meeting are planned to set priorities and review progress. Data is continuing to be loaded to the system and currently there are over 12,000 photos installed. Several large bulk uploads are in work for transition including the 114,000 record GN AFE files. Over 400 collection level records have been uploaded from the Burien files and accession records at Jackson Street Roundhouse are nearly ready. A process document has been created and a data template for photograph cataloging. In late December 2022 a link was placed on the PNRA home page to the ("under construction") AtoM railroad catalog.

"Out of Scope" Collection Relocation

While the vast majority of material that is donated to the PNRA fits within our mission we do get material that is not relevant to our needs. In these cases we contact other historical institutions around the country to see if they have an interest. In the last quarter we transferred material to the The Pennsylvania Railroad Technical & Historical Society; New York Central System Historical Society; and recently some blueprints for Norfolk & Western steam locomotive boilers were sent to the Norfolk & Western Historical Society.
