Collection Acquisitions

Over the last quarter the PNRA has acquired several significant collections.

Norm Hochhalter Collection

In late February 2023 PNRA received the Norm Hochhalter collection. Norm was an avid railroad photographer and he was able to capture many interesting images of Spokane, and the Inland Empire, during his many years of photography.

Norm, and his father, Art, were best known as model builders and Norm, a draftsperson by trade, would visit and painstakingly measure various railroad structures around the Inland Empire. He would then create CAD drawings of the structure (depots, roundhouses, bridges, towers, etc). He paired his CAD drawings with photographs he took and he would sell these at train shows. While the structures he drew have succumbed to time, he created a legacy of images and drawing that facilitate modelers and historians.

Perhaps his most famous model creation was an 'O' gauge model of the Great Northern passenger depot on Havermale Island, in Spokane. His file of drawings and pictures is at least an inch thick. It took Norm and his Dad four years to design and build the depot, which still exists on a model railroad layout in Western Washington. The tower of the depot is four feet high. All four of the clocks in the tower work, although Norm told me that the clocks didn't keep the same time.

This collection will be of great interest to modelers and historians. A special thank you to Terry and Gary Dowler for their help in the preservation of this fine collection.

Bill Baker Collection

The Bill Baker Collection consists of slides, negatives and photos from the mid 1950's to around 2001. The slides, which number over 4,000, capture a variety of subjects from the last years of Northern Pacific steam to the diesel and electric trains of the NP, GN, UP and Milwaukee Road. Bill also made other trips to Portland, OR, Vancouver, BC and around the United States. The first of the slides were taken by Bill in 1955 when he

was only 16. Work has already begun on scanning the slides and some of these are assisting in the creation of articles for the Union Pacific Historical Society quarterly magazine "The Streamliner."
